## *A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor*

Starting his professional career as a lawyer near ancient Antioch, Saint John Chrysostom eventually became an ascetic hermit. His two years of hermetic living damaged his body but inspired his eloquent preaching. Indeed, his last name meaning “golden-mouthed” in Greek attests to this gift. His tenure as Patriarch (Archbishop) of Constantinople was consumed by opposition to heresy, paganism, and decadence. John died in exile.

Acclaimed for his preaching skills, John’s Cathedral was packed by a standing room only congregation. The people of Eastern Rome came from all over the Empire to listen to his homilies. John was recorded in one sermon saying, “Preaching improves me. When I begin to speak, weariness disappears; when I begin to teach, fatigue too disappears. Thus neither sickness itself nor indeed any other obstacle is able to separate me from your love. . . . For just as you are hungry to listen to me, so too I am hungry to preach to you.” The Holy Spirit worked powerfully in his preaching.

Priests and deacons are charged by the Church with the responsibility to preach. Homiletics is the primary office of the priesthood. We have all heard great preachers who seem inspired by the Holy Spirit and focused on God. At the same time, we have all been burdened by inadequate preachers who are inappropriately humorous, long-winded, and self-referential. Simply, a sermon teaches about a moral subject or theological point whereas a homily explains Scripture in the context of modern life.

Sometimes priests and deacons are afraid to preach about controversial topics. Social issues are especially difficult to preach about because our American society confuses them for political issues. However, social issues should not be the only content for preaching each week. The liturgical seasons each have a theme perfectly suited for preaching. For example, Advent both prepares for Christmas and alludes to the Second Coming of Christ. So, we should not suffer through a homily on Christmas Day about the plight of taxpayers as I once heard at a former parish.

Congregations could be more forgiving or patient with a preacher who may say something challenging in charity. Many priests are discouraged by anonymous letters complaining about a homily often misheard or misunderstood. So too, congregations rightfully expect something well-prepared and faithful to Church teaching.

Preaching is an essential part of the Liturgy of the Word. We listen to the readings from the Lectionary which are then broken open for us during the homily. I encourage everyone to prepare for the homily by prayerfully reading the upcoming Sunday lectionary throughout the week.

As an aside, I am still on track to return in September after my post-deployment processing in Norfolk. The next few weeks will be occupied by turnover at my base while waiting for my military air ticketing from the Navy. Once again, I want to share my gratitude for your support, especially for Fr. Bill as he generously covered down after Fr. Tom’s early departure.
