A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor

Many of our older parishioners will be familiar with the Baltimore Catechism. This textbook was the standard teaching material for religious education in the United States for over a century. The catechetical method was based on questions and answers. For example, Question Six asks, “Why did God make you?” with the answer, “God made me to know, love, and serve Him in this world, and to be happy with Him for ever in heaven.” Religious education has moved away from the rote memorization preferred by the question-answer format. However, do we still adequately know the faith?

Saint Peter wrote, “But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect.” If this was true for Peter’s recipients in the ancient Roman provinces of Asia Minor, it is still true for us today. Indeed, as the theological axiom *fides quarens intellectum* holds, our faith seeks to understand the very mysteries we profess to believe. It is necessary to know our faith so we can grow in love of God. Faith without knowledge is superstition; knowledge without belief is skepticism.

We desire to know about God and to know him relationally. We cannot love who we do not know! Church commentators have identified several possible reasons for the decline in catechetical knowledge. Some suggest a major impact was the change in teacher staffing from Religious Orders lay professionals. Others posit a generational gap in knowledge which prevents handing on the faith. Still more theorize a negative impact from heterodox catechesis. Whatever may be the reason, we need to recover an authentic transmission of the faith.

If we do not want to be the last generation of Catholics in our respective families, then we need to be charitably courageous in sharing the faith. As Bishop Hicks often teaches, evangelization and catechesis are not the professional duties of clergy. Every parishioner is responsible for sharing our faith in the context of their own lives. Western society is no longer anti-Christian. It is post-religious. Evangelizing a secular world requires charity and truth.

No program can restore the faith. It will start from relationships. We need to reintroduce a secular world to Jesus. After they come to believe in him, we can teach about how to rightly follow him. This paradigm of relationship, introduction, and following can be simplified as belonging, belief, and behavior. Remember, we cannot give what we do not first have ourselves. We model this faithful relationship by our own conduct. The most effective argument for atheism is a scornful and hypocritical believer.

In the end, we are encouraged to pray for the restoration of Christendom. Evangelization and catechesis are our collective responsibilities to the faith. In a particular way during this Eucharistic Revival, we should invite others to Mass so they can be reintroduced to Jesus in the Eucharist.

Phase Two of Parking Lot Project to Be Completed This Coming Week

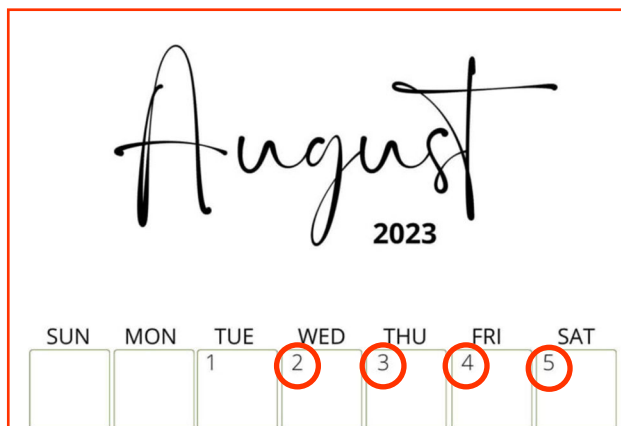

On Saturday, August 5th work will be concluded in the Ministry Center Parking Lot accessed from Park Blvd. The entire lot on that side of the church will be closed to all traffic, but will be reopen at 3:00 P.M. Those attending Confessions and Mass may park in either lot.

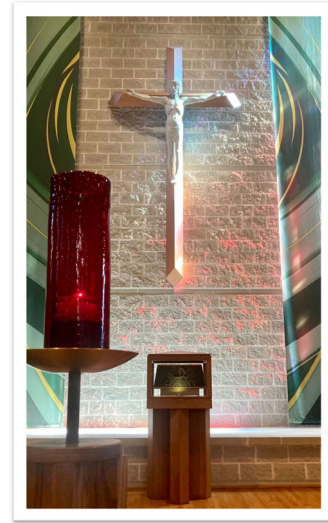

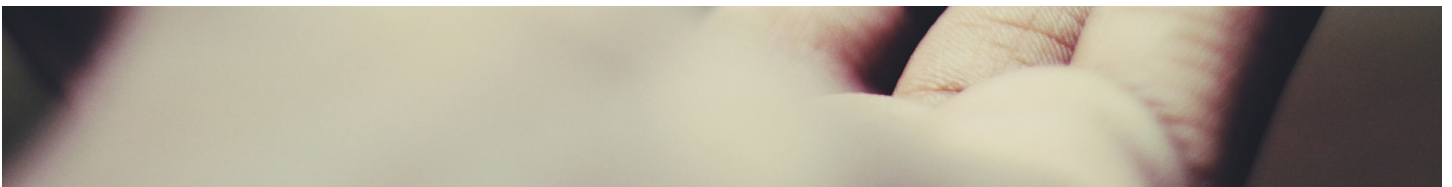
