## A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor

The original draft of my bulletin article for this weekend was about Saint John Paul II. His feast day is this Sunday. However, I have been made aware of confusion and rumor about my delayed return. Therefore, I am sharing with you the very few details made available to me. First, I am waiting for discharge paperwork to be released from active duty. Second, this paperwork has been affected by persistent and ongoing issues with processing. Third, the Diocese is aware of these delays. Finally, I am anxious to return to the parish for reintegration and normalcy. Most importantly, thank you for your patience and understanding.

As above, John Paul II's personal holiness remains his legacy to the Church. He maintained his human dignity while suffering and dying from Parkinson's disease. His witness directly challenged the postmodern obsession with comfort and euthanasia. His dignity became a "living encyclical" incarnating the words of his Apostolic Letter *Salvifici Doloris*, On the Christian Meaning of Human Suffering. Our world needs more saints like John Paul. He did not allow suffering like World War II or Parkinson's disease to diminish or destroy his faith in God.

My personal devotion to this Saint is inspired by the clarity and beauty of his teaching authority as the Roman Pontiff. He was vilified by progressive ideologues among the hierarchy as a conservative reactionary after the halcyon days of the Second Vatican Council. Pope John Paul II reaffirmed unchanging Church doctrine after their purposeful misimplementation of the documents of the Council. Their deconstructionist hubris did not permit them to see that Karol Wojtyła was not a conservative ideologue—he was Catholic.

This Saint from Kraków continues to remind us to "Be not afraid!" We have the joy and responsibility as inheritors of the faith to live courageously for God in a secular age.

Do not be satisfied with mediocrity. ... Do not be afraid to be holy! Have the courage and humility to present yourselves to the world determined to be holy, since full, true freedom is born from holiness. This aspiration will help you discover genuine love.

Hopefully these words encourage us to a similar human and spiritual dignity like John Paul. His life is a pattern for our lives. This is why we have saints. They inspire us because they have already gone before us in faith. Our lifelong struggle for holiness is possible just as it was possible for John Paul.

Future Pope Benedict XVI, then-Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger, in his capacity as Dean of the College of Cardinals preached the Requiem Mass for Pope John Paul II. He said of his friend, "the Pope who tried to meet everyone, who had an ability to forgive and to open his heart to all, tells us once again today, with these words of the Lord, that by abiding in the love of Christ we learn, at the school of Christ, the art of true love." Saint John Paul the Great, pray for us!

## **All Souls Day & The Table of Remembrance**

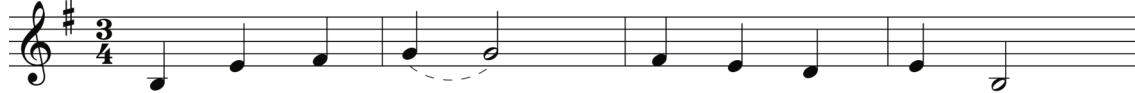

## THE WHY ❄️

Our parish staff has identified that the time has come for Saint James the Apostle Parish to purchase new hymnals. We have not used hymnals for nearly two decades!

We have made do until now by printing worship aids at great cost per year. This is unsustainable as we seek to be good stewards of the temporal goods of the parish.

The bishops have invited us to be more reverent in our worship at Mass as a part of the National Eucharistic Revival. The time has come to add some exciting new music to our parish repertoire and restore the place of Sacred Music during our liturgies.

## THE WHEN ❄️

To accomplish this, we hope to raise the money and purchase our new hymnals (*with the Sunday Readings included*) by this coming Christmas season. Saint James the Apostle is in need of your help and

support. We are in need of 400 hymnals for our pews along with 40 choir books and various accompaniment editions.

We are asking parishioners to donate \$30 per hymnal. You may donate as many hymnals as you like. You may also dedicate each hymnal you donate to the memory of a loved one, in commemoration of a favorite saint, or in honor of your family or friends. There will be a label placed inside the cover to commemorate these dedications.

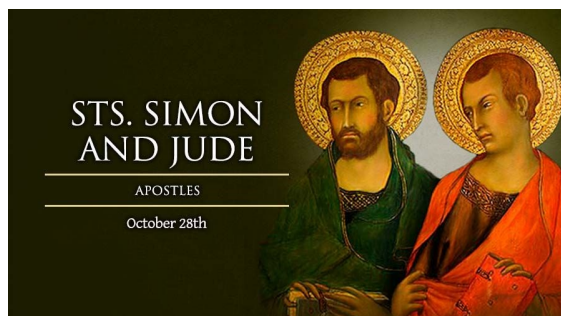

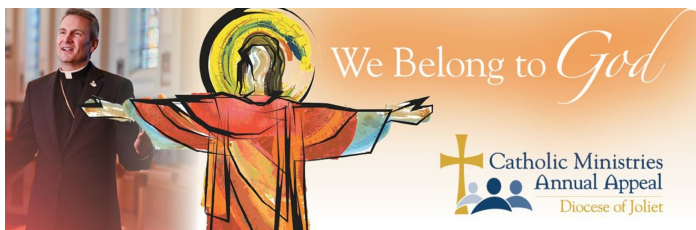
