A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor

As we continue our spiritual journey in this holy Season of Advent, it is important to remember that our preparations during this sacred time will make for a better celebration of the coming festivities. We need to recover the original and true meaning of Advent to restore the celebration of Christmas. Our prayer and self-denial, much like Lent, will make our later celebration of Christ's birth more meaningful. Christmas will be enhanced by reclaiming Advent for itself and properly commemorating the Liturgical Season of Christmas.


Gift giving is a special part of our celebrations. As the Prayer of Saint Francis reminds us, "It is in giving that we receive." Our parish generously responded to the 59th Annual Christmas Basket Program. Your generosity directly impacted 814 people from 198 families by providing Christmas gifts. In particular, 46 additional families received over \$13,000 in Crusader Cash gift cards. This has the added benefit of supporting Catholic education at our parochial school and religious education program. Thank you to the many volunteers who helped make this possible, especially our Knights of Columbus and our lead Mike Progar.

On the subject of parish generosity, we have been blessed by the many volunteers who supported the parish library. Thank you to Peggy Carey, Janet Culligan, Diane Davy, Marilyn Potyen, and Joanne Yasko for their time and talent. We collaboratively decided to repurpose the library space for the music ministry as use of the parish library has declined significantly since the pandemic. The remaining books will be lovingly donated to nearby parish libraries in the hope of more use. This will allow our music ministry adequate space for enhancing their ministry during the Eucharistic Revival's effort to improve the reverence of our liturgies.

As mentioned above, the Liturgical Season of Advent encourages us to pause and recollect before Christmas. The intentional use of our time in prayer and self-denial creatively and imaginatively invites us to walk with the Saints Joseph and Mary as they journey to Bethlehem. They were not overwhelmed by the frenetic distractions of decorating, socializing, buying, giving, and getting. Instead, they were resolutely focused on finding a place for their Son. Their intentionality inspires us to a similar freedom. Remember, the presents and celebration came after Christmas on the Epiphany!

Advent also points to another journey. Just as we prepare for the first coming of Christ at his birth we also prepare ourselves for the second coming of Christ at the end of all things. Creation itself will be made new. All things will be resolved in Christ. Heaven and earth will pass away. The liturgies of these holy weeks focus on this twofold meaning of the season. Our prayerful preparation keeps both of these in mind. As always, we join the prayer of longing and joyful expectation, "Come, Lord Jesus."

The Second Sunday of Advent

First Reading | Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11

- Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her service is at an end, her guilt is expiated; indeed, she has received from the hand of the LORD double for all her sins.
- A voice cries out: In the desert prepare the way of the LORD! Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God! Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill shall be made low; the rugged land shall be made a plain, the rough country, a broad valley.
- Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together; for the mouth of the LORD has spoken.
- Go up on to a high mountain, Zion, herald of glad tidings; cry out at the top of your voice, Jerusalem, herald of good news!
- Fear not to cry out and say to the cities of Judah: Here is your God! Here comes with power the Lord GOD, who rules by his strong arm; here is his reward with him, his recompense before him.
- Like a shepherd he feeds his flock; in his arms he gathers the lambs, carrying them in his bosom, and leading the ewes with care.

The Word of the Lord: Thanks Be to God!

Second Reading | 2 Peter 3:8 - 14

Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years and a thousand years like one day.

The Lord does not delay his promise, as some regard "delay," but he is patient with you, not wishing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance.

But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a mighty roar and the elements will be dissolved by fire, and the earth and everything done on it will be found out.

Since everything is to be dissolved in this way, what sort of persons ought you to be, conducting yourselves in holiness and devotion, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be dissolved in flames and the elements melted by fire.

But according to his promise we await new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells.

Therefore, beloved, since you await these things, be eager to be found without spot or blemish before him, at peace.

The Word of the Lord: **Thanks Be to God!**

Gospel | Mark 1:1 - 8

The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God.

As it is written in Isaiah the prophet: Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way. A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths."

John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins.

John was clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. He fed on locusts and wild honey.

And this is what he proclaimed: "One mightier than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals.

I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."


Have you ever considered serving the Lord and your parish community? Do you enjoy experiencing a liturgy that is well executed and welcoming? If so, we need your help.







Repurposing Broken Rosaries/Rosary Parts


This is a way to empower a family in need, to connect with information that can help them. Each refurbished PC has links to help students with
