Sunday, January 7, 2024 | The Epiphany of the Lord

A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor

The Solemnity of the Epiphany commemorates the journey of the Magi from the East to visit the infant Jesus. Tradition names the Three Wise Men as Melchior, Caspar, and Balthasar. They may have come from Syria or Persia as Zoroastrian priests. While Herod and the Jews worried that the newborn Messiah was a political threat, these three foreigners recognized him as the Heavenly King. They brought with them gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Melchior gave frankincense, a type of ritual incense, as a symbol of the Priesthood of Jesus. Caspar gave baby Jesus gold as a sign of his kingship. Balthasar gave Jesus myrrh, a burial anointing oil, as a prefigurement of his death. The gifts of the Magi is recounted in the familiar Christmas carol “We Three Kings” which tells the story of their journey and encounter with the infant Jesus. They were so transformed by their encounter that they went home by another way.

Traditionally, Epiphany had two liturgical observances unique to this Solemnity. First, there would be a blessing of holy water. The blessing of Epiphany water comes from the Eastern Churches. It was eventually adopted into the Roman Rite. This year we will drain our baptismal font and bless the newly filled water at the Saturday evening Mass on Epiphany. Second, the homes of the parishioners would be blessed with chalk.

The “chalking of the door” would take place as a pastoral visit to the parish homes. The priest or deacon would write the blessing YY+C+M+B+YY at the threshold. The blessing was *Christus mansionem benedicat*, “May Christ bless this house,” so this year would be 20+C+M+B+24. Unfortunately, many people no longer practice their faith and there are too few priests to visit every home. However, the faithful are encouraged to ask God to bless their house and the home life within for peace.

Our religion is not a myth nor a fairytale. Priests are not wizards or magicians. Grace is real. Salvation is necessary. The Incarnation happened. Our religious observances throughout the Christmas season are not about us. Instead, we celebrate the salvation offered by the infant Jesus. He alone can save us from sin and death.

We walk with the Magi to Bethlehem to greet this strange God who defies and subverts our expectations. He was born with all the vulnerability of a baby and none of the power of a conqueror. In turn, like the Magi, we should bring some gift to him who gives us all good things. The words of the old hymn become our prayer, “What can I give Him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb; If I were a Wise Man, I would do my part; Yet what I can I give Him: give my heart.”

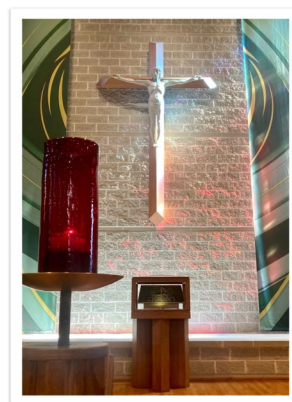

1. GETTING READY

The Church is Jesus' house, and Jesus is my King. When I get ready for Mass, it's nice to dress up because it is so special to be in the King's house. I make sure I am clean and neat when I go to Mass. I especially make sure I brush my teeth!

2. LISTENING

During the first part of the Mass, we read from the Bible. I ask God what he wants to tell me today, and listen to the stories. God likes to talk to us through his Word. Maybe he has a message for me!



3. MY GIFT FOR JESUS

After the readings, we pass around a basket to collect gifts for the Church and the poor. Grown-ups usually give money, but Jesus wants something even more special from kids. I think of something I can offer Jesus in my heart and imagine my gift going up to the altar with the bread and wine. God is about to do something really amazing with our gifts.



4. THE MIRACLE

When I hear Jesus' words, "This is my body," a miracle happens! God changes the bread and wine into the real Body and Blood of Jesus. The host still looks like bread, but Jesus is there in disguise.



5. JESUS COMES INTO MY HEART

I fold my hands reverently in the Communion line. When I receive Jesus, I thank him for visiting me in this amazing way. While I wait for everyone else to receive communion, this is the perfect time to have a private conversation with Jesus in my heart.

The Epiphany of the Lord

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

It's interesting how an event can be interpreted by different people. God's revelation of himself in the birth of the child Jesus is clearly one such event. The Magi, Gentiles from the east, had heard of this "newborn king of the Jews" and undertook a long and arduous journey to see him and offer him homage. They were edified and eager in their search. Herod, himself a king – of the Jews – did not have the same reaction. The very thought of this "newborn king" threatened him and filled him with rage and suspicion. In this moment in human history, the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles (i.e., the Epiphany) unveils the truth of God's redemptive work for all of creation to be reconciled to himself. This truth has been accepted and rejected throughout time, and our celebration of this feast gives us an opportunity to give thanks in a focused and particular way for our acceptance of it – to give thanks for the gift of our faith. Perhaps it is even a moment for us to have our own, colloquial epiphany: an "aha moment," where we once again truly understand the depth of God's love for us.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The Magi, the Gentiles from the east, were changed after their encounter with the Christ Child; they were warned not to return to Herod and they obeyed and took a different route home. In today's second reading, St. Paul says it has been revealed that Gentiles are "coheirs, members of the same body" – the body of Christ. Just as the magi were forever changed by their journey, so must we be. Their journey is a model for us, but we do not have to seek Christ in the world as they did; he is here with us, in Word and in the Eucharist. The Incarnation of Jesus is pure gift to our weary, troubled world. As we heard in Isaiah, "rise up! ... [our] light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon [us]." As the Magi followed the light of the star, let us rise to the occasion and respond to God's light in our world by recognizing the good gifts God gives us each day. And then thank him for his enduring presence in our lives.

PRAY *Lord God of heaven and earth,
you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation
by the guidance of a star ...
Fill us with the light of Christ,
that our concern for others may reflect your love.
We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen*

Speaker: Rev. David Mowry, S.T.L., DMin., Assistant Professor, Waud Chair of Homiletics, Department of Biblical Studies and Homiletics



Father David is a Roman Catholic priest of the Diocese of Joliet in Illinois and ordained on May 18, 2013. He has spent years sharing his enthusiasm and joy as a preacher, retreat leader, and speaker. He currently serves as an instructor in the Department of Biblical Studies and Homiletics at the University of St. Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary. He has B.A. (Philosophy and Catholic Studies), University of St. Thomas, St. Paul, MN; S.T.B., M.Div., S.T.L., University of St. Mary of the Lake. Fr. David was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Joliet in 2013. He has served as a Parochial Vicar of Immaculate Conception Parish in Elmhurst (2013-2016) and St. Mary Immaculate Parish in Plainfield (2016-2018), as a Director of Ongoing Formation for Priests of the Diocese of Joliet (2017-2019) and had been a member of the Catholic Association of Teachers of Homiletics and the Academy of Homiletics.

Fr. David was born July 11, 1987 to Joan and Keith and was baptized on Oct. 25 of the same year. After a few years in Elmhurst and a move to the Washington D.C. area, his family returned to Illinois and settled in Glen Ellyn. He attended parochial school at his home parish of St. Petronille and graduated from there in 2001. He was ordained to the diaconate on June 2, 2012, and served as a deacon at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Addison.

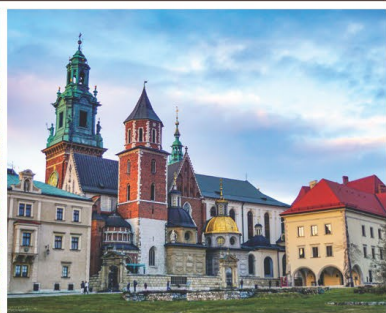
