A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor

The Season of Lent is marked by the practice of self-denial. Holy Mother Church invites us to renewed prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We pray to grow in our relationship with God. We fast as a reminder that God alone satisfies our deepest desires. And, we act charitably to become more generous. Lent is not only a time for self-denial but it also mirrors Christ's own forty days of prayer and fasting in the desert. He battled the temptations of the Devil to tempting comfort instead of the coming crucifixion.

Our Lenten disciplines educate and prepare the soul for the Resurrection of Our Lord on Easter Sunday just as our penitential practices in Advent prepared us for the Nativity of Our Lord on Christmas. Many people struggle to maintain their Lenten penance due to the inconstancy of human nature. If you are feeling inconsistent during Lent, please consider attending our next Lenten reflection on Thursday, March 7th at 7pm. Our youth minister, Gina Wiedman, will be offering a reflection titled "Lenten Reset." This practical and spiritual reflection will help us complete the remaining weeks of Lent with a rededicated spirit.

Lent encourages us to rededicate ourselves to a more regular practice of our faith. Perhaps you find yourself preoccupied by other competing priorities during the year so you may miss attending some Masses. Lent is a good time to regularly attend Mass, including daily Mass, in an effort to build and maintain a habit of Eucharistic prayer. The National Eucharistic Revival is not something we set aside or ignore during Lent. Instead, we can use this time of penance to practice self-denial even in how we use our time by making more time for Mass. The forty-five minutes to an hour we spend on Sunday might be the only time for most of us when we can simply enjoy intentional silence without having to do anything but show up!

Speaking of Mass attendance, many of you have asked me about restoring our former Mass schedule. Before 2013, our Mass schedule was Saturday at 5pm, Sunday at 7:30, 9:30, and 11:30am with a 6pm "youth" Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays at 6pm. This Sunday evening Mass was gradually phased out by 2014. The following year, in 2015, the revised schedule was Saturday at 4pm and Sunday at 9 and 11am. The pandemic reopening kept the same Mass schedule from 2015 in 2021 to present. The only "change" I made since my arrival in 2022 was restoring daily Mass on Fridays instead of a Communion Service to better align our parish with the Eucharistic Revival.

I shared your desire to restore our Mass schedule with the Episcopal Vicar for Clergy. He told me, "You need to be able to manage your mass schedule on our own." He issued this as a directive to me based on our declining enrollment (halved since 2017) along with the dire lack of priestly vocations. We cannot rely on Bishop Conlon and Fr. Bill in their retirements. Our future planning must consider the possibility of a parish with one or even less resident priests.

Finally, a few parishioners have asked me about permission from the Diocese to resume offering Holy Communion under both species, meaning, not only the Most Holy Body of Christ but also his Most Precious Blood. Unbeknownst to me while deployed, the Diocese has permitted offering Holy Communion under both species since last July. However, after reviewing and evaluating the number of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, we do not have a sufficient number of volunteers to offer the Precious Blood in addition to the seven Holy Communion stations we already have to fill at each Mass.

This information should not be discouraging. We are being invited by God to a new urgency. You must share the faith with your family and friends. Our parish has half as many parishioners and Masses as we did just ten years ago. This is an opportunity to become aware of the situation and, most importantly, remember all the things we love about our parish. I feel a spiritual-paternal pride in the good things about Saint James... everything from the generosity of our volunteers to the beauty of our school students singing at Wednesday Mass. What do you love about our parish? Remember to share it with others!

Now that we have beautiful new hymnals, which contain centuries of sacred hymnody, we are called to put these books and our voices to good use, for the Glory of God, and for the benefit of this faith community. I challenge everyone to participate in the liturgy by offering your unique and God-given voice. A familiar adage states, "if God gave you a bad voice – give it back to God." Remaining silent and unresponsive is certainly the easy approach. However, our church calls us to 'full, conscious, and active participation in the liturgy." Won't you join us? —Dr. Marc Alan Brunelle, Dir of Sacred Liturgy

Dear Fellow Parishioners,


