A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor

Two weeks ago, I shared my hope with everyone for a parish culture of healthy communication. It is most helpful to carefully read the various announcements made about the events and activities at our parish in the bulletin, on our website, and through Flocknote. Transparency is an important element of the institutional health of our parish. I was encouraged by how well my aspiration was received. In particular, I am hopeful that parishioners will share their expectations, requests, and complaints with me instead of putting the staff and volunteers in the awkward position of speaking on my behalf.

With this aspiration in mind, I want to stress the most important indicator of operational vitality at our parish, namely, evangelization. As shared over the last several weeks, the factual data about current trends may tempt us to discouragement. We are afraid to become aware of the obvious decline in vitality. We prefer to leave these trends unacknowledged while continuing with our ministries and programs in the same ways while expecting better results. This is as unsustainable as it is unrealistic and unacceptable.

Change is never easy due to the human condition's preference for stability despite the societal pressure for new experiences. We should not seek change for its own sake as if innovation is somehow an improvement for itself. However, it is just as foolish to live in denial. We reject the discouragement proposed by temptation. Instead, we embrace this spiritual moment as an invitation for renewal. This is the only acceptable response because "hope does not disappoint" as Saint Paul reminds us.

I feel an intense urgency to make you aware of our spiritual condition, move you away from discouragement, and compel you to evangelization. We need to share our faith with others, especially our families and friends. The future of our parish depends on evangelization.

How do we evangelize? Many Churches attempt evangelization by offering different programs and activities without realizing people estranged from faith will not come. It is never enough to simply welcome people; we need to invite them to come. The most effective evangelization is by invitation. We can share the good things God has done for us while reminding them God can do the same for them. This is the most important obligation and responsibility for parents and grandparents. Evangelization is not the professional duties of clergy; evangelization must begin at home.

Pope Benedict XVI said of evangelization, "This is not something optional, but the very vocation of the People of God, a duty that corresponds to it by the command of none other than the Lord Jesus Christ himself." Once again, in light of these articles over the last few weeks, please prayerfully reflect on the essential questions. Do you want to be the last Catholic in your family? Do you want to be the last generation of Catholics at Saint James? If not, then what are you willing to do about it?

Join Us as We Bid a Fond Farewell to the "Alleluia" for the Season of Lent Tuesday, February 13th at 6:00 P.M. in the Church Evening Vespers with the Burial of the Alleluia

The Burial of the Alleluia is an ancient custom. On the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, we will bid this sacred word a fond farewell for the duration of Lent.


We invite you to Evening Vespers and the Burial of the Alleluia on Tuesday, February 13th at 6 P.M. in the church.

The Alleluia will only emerge again at the Easter Vigil after the 40 days of Lent, when we hear the Church proclaim the Resurrection of Our Lord. The deacon approaches the Celebrant with the words, "I announce to you a great joy: it is the Alleluia." And the priest sings it in three different keys before the gospel of the Holy Saturday Mass, the choir repeats it jubilantly, and we all rejoice again: Alleluia!

At the end of Evening Vespers, a placard with the 'Alleluia' in ornate, gold letters is taken from the Sanctuary and "buried"—placed under the altar cloth.

A Family Project for Lent

Consider using the coloring page on the next page for your own burying of the Alleluia as your family's Lenten tradition. Before you bury it spend quiet time in reflection— adorning the Alleluia and adding your prayer intention on the reverse side. Incorporate the corporal and spiritual works of mercy in your intention. Put it in a box or bury it some other way. Prepare to rejoice emphatically on the night of Holy Saturday at Easter Vigil when the Alleluia is intoned and repeated three times, in joyful glory of the Resurrection of Christ.



In 2018, he completed a course of student teaching in junior high religion at Bishop McNamara Catholic School in Kankakee and entered Mundelein Seminary shortly thereafter. He was accepted to the Pontifical School of Theology and earned a Baccalaureate in Sacred Theology and a Master of Divinity simultaneously, graduating 'cum laude' in May 2022. He was ordained a priest at the hands of the Most Reverend Ronald A. Hicks, Bishop of Joliet, on May 21, 2022 and

celebrated his First Mass of Thanksgiving at St. Mary Parish in Mokena the following day. Within the Diocese of Joliet, he has been assigned to St. John Paul II Parish in Kankakee, the Church of St. Jude in Joliet and, most recently, St. Mary Immaculate Parish in Plainfield, where he served both as a deacon and as the Director of Youth and Young Adult Formation.
