A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor

The Lent is a penitential season of self-denial. We pray, fast, and give alms to discipline ourselves in preparation for Easter. At the same time, Lent is a time of reflection to grow in awareness of our sinfulness as an invitation to receive God's mercy. We are reluctant to admit our sinfulness for different reasons. Saint John wrote, "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us." Perhaps we try to deceive ourselves and God into seeing only our best qualities. Deception is easier than admitting we are sinners because only a sinner needs a savior.

Sin is born of disobedience. Our stained glass windows depict the moment of original sin when Adam and Eve, our "first parents," are dismissed from the Garden. They grasped for the forbidden fruit to become more like God. Their story involves the tempting insinuation of the serpent to inspire in them suspicion of God's intentions toward them. God does not react by rejecting them. Instead, he responds with mercy by calling out, "Adam, where are you?" He extends this same mercy to us when we sin.

Their expulsion from Eden is described as "the Fall" whereby sin and death entered into the human condition. This fallen state affects all people like "spiritual genetics" passed on from generation to generation. Every sin is a repetition of this original moment of disobedience. Sin is turning away from God toward the lower and lesser things of this world. We are enticed by impermanent things because of concupiscence, the fallen appetite for wealth, pleasure, power, and honor. We could rephrase these temptations in modern language as greed, lust, control, and reputation. The concupiscible appetite prefers these passing things over the lasting experience of faith, hope, and love.

Saint Augustine preached, "We should be displeased with ourselves when we commit sin, for sin is displeasing to God. Sinful though we are, let us at least be like God in this, that we are displeased at what displeases him. In some measure then you will be in harmony with God's will, because you find displeasing in yourself what is abhorrent to your Creator." Contrition is the appropriate response to our sins. However, we sometimes replace this sorrow with feelings of despair. Despair is the denial of God's mercy leading to permissiveness for further sin.

Presumption is connected to concupiscence. Sometimes we sin expecting God's mercy. It is true that God always forgives a repentant sinner. However, mercy is not an excuse for sin. Those growing and perfected in holiness feel sorrow for their sins out of love for God. This is called perfect contrition. Whereas, some feel sorrow for their sins because of a fear of hell. This is called imperfect contrition. God is merciful to us whether or not we feel perfect or imperfect contrition. His forgiveness does not depend on our feelings.

Our penance during Lent prepares us for Easter. The Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ is victorious over the sin of Adam and Eve. The Risen Lord conquered sin and death. We sing about the mysterious relationship between sin and the resurrection at the Easter Proclamation. The *Exsultet* says of Jesus, "Who for our sake paid Adam's debt to the eternal Father, and, pouring out his own dear Blood, wiped clean the record of our ancient sinfulness," continuing, "O truly necessary sin of Adam, destroyed completely by the Death of Christ! O happy fault that earned so great, so glorious a Redeemer!" Christ would not have been born as one of us, lived like one of us, died like one of us, and risen from the dead for all of us without the first sin of Adam. Sinners need a savior.

We should not be discouraged by our sins even as we feel contrite. Saint Paul taught the Romans, "where sin increased, grace abounded all the more." Forgiveness is the free and unmerited response by God to our sins. May the Passion of His Blood wash away our sins and free us for new life.

Now that we have beautiful new hymnals, which contain centuries of sacred hymnody, we are called to put these books and our voices to good use, for the Glory of God, and for the benefit of this faith community. I challenge everyone to participate in the liturgy by offering your unique and God-given voice. A familiar adage states, "if God gave you a bad voice – give it back to God." Remaining silent and unresponsive is certainly the easy approach. However, our church calls us to 'full, conscious, and active participation in the liturgy." Won't you join us? —Dr. Marc Alan Brunelle, Dir of Sacred Liturgy

KNIGHTS CORNER




