**Sunday, March 31, 2024 | Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord**

## *A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor*

Happy Easter! Today is the holiest day of the year when we celebrate the salvation made possible by the Resurrection. The Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ conquered sin and death. The joy and hope offered by the Resurrection inspires many people to return to Church on Easter after an absence since Christmas and Ash Wednesday. God invites all of us to rejoice on this holiest day whether or not we regularly practice our faith or attend Mass. May our celebrations this weekend remind us of his enduring presence in our daily lives throughout the year.

Historically, Christians would greet one another during Easter with the Paschal Greeting, “Christus surrēxit! Surrēxit vere, alleluia”, “Christ is risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!” This greeting probably came from Saint Luke’s account of the Road to Emmaus. Jesus appeared to Cleopas and an unnamed Disciple after his resurrection. They returned to Jerusalem to share with the other disciples, “The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!” Their words have been handed down from generation to generation as an expression of Paschal joy.

The Resurrection was more than a clinical resuscitation. Jesus was not brought back to life in a medical sense like we sometimes hear about on the news for survivors of catastrophes. Instead, Jesus truly died and rose from the dead. God raised Jesus from the dead after three days in the tomb. He appeared first to Saint Mary Magdalene before appearing to his disciples. His body was glorified, much like the Transfiguration forty days or so before his crucifixion, but still bore the wounds in his hands, feet, and side.

The many images and symbols of the Resurrection educate us in the deeper meaning of this mystery in our own lives. Everything from the empty tomb to the post-resurrection appearances by Jesus reveal the power of the resurrection over sin and death. Easter makes our salvation possible by unlocking the gates of Heaven, forgiving sins, and promising eternal life. These images endure more powerfully than secular symbols like springtime, eggs, and bunnies. These pagan symbols only have any meaning at all because of the supernatural mysteries we celebrate on Easter.

Among the many arguments against Christianity, there is a frequent allusion to the similarity between Christian symbols and pagan symbols. For example, atheists offer the example of pagan yuletide as an argument against Christmas. Easter, too, is often questioned due to similarities with the pagan, pre-Christian vernal equinox at springtime. However, these similarities do not acknowledge the intentionality of Divine Providence to make the spiritual mysteries of Christianity understandable and accessible using the context of human history and customs.

Speaking of images and symbols, you may have noticed the installation of the INRI plaque on the crucifix above the corpus. This is the original mold of the INRI plaque which was designed for our cross back in 1999. The original artist’s son found it in his studio in Milwaukee. We are grateful to bring this project to completion after twenty-five years!

Christianity ‘baptizes’ human history and customs into the mysteries of our faith. The Paschal Mystery is the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. He was born as one of us, lived and died like all of us, and rose from the dead for all of us. The events of Easter truly happened. Our liturgical celebrations are more than a commemoration of historical events. God invites us to participate in the very mysteries we celebrate at Mass.

## **THE DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY CELEBRATION SUNDAY, APRIL 7TH AT 3:00 P.M.**

We invite all parishioners to privately participate in the Divine Mercy Novena in preparation for the St. James Celebration of the Feast of Divine Mercy on Sunday, April 7th from 3 - 4 P.M. in the church. The Divine Mercy Novena prayers may be found at: <https://www.thedivinemercy.org/message/devotions/novena> and begin Friday, March 29th and conclude on Sunday, April 7th.

The Church grants a plenary indulgence, total expiation of sin and temporal effects, for those who meet the following conditions: sacramental confession (20 days before or after the Feast of Divine Mercy), reception of Holy Communion, complete detachment from sin, participation in divine mercy prayers, and praying for the intentions of the Pope.

Homebound or ill Catholics, unable to meet the conditions outlined above, may obtain an indulgence with the recitation of the Our Father and Creed before an image of Jesus, adding the prayer "Merciful Jesus, I trust in you," while detached from sin with the intention to fulfill the other requirements above as soon as possible. The faithful are encouraged to offer their personal sufferings in unity with Jesus.

### **OUR ST. JAMES CELEBRATION**

We will pray the Chaplet and have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Fr. Bill will hear confessions from 3 - 4 P.M. Fr. Keith will hear confessions for 30 minutes during the time for silent prayer, before concluding the time of Adoration with Benediction. For those who want to receive the plenary indulgence, we encourage you to celebrate Reconciliation in the 20 days before or after the Feast of Divine Mercy rather than on the day itself.

To conclude our time of prayer, Fr. Keith will offer an individual blessing with the first class relic of Saint Faustina at 4 P.M. *after* benediction. Therefore, confessions will stop at 4 P.M. We hope you will join us!

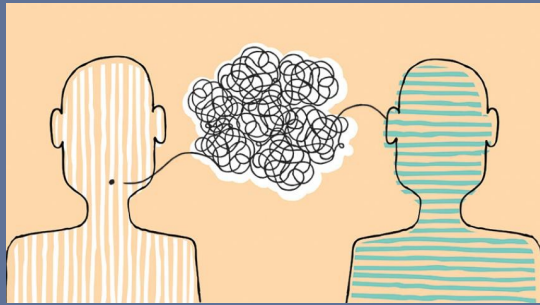

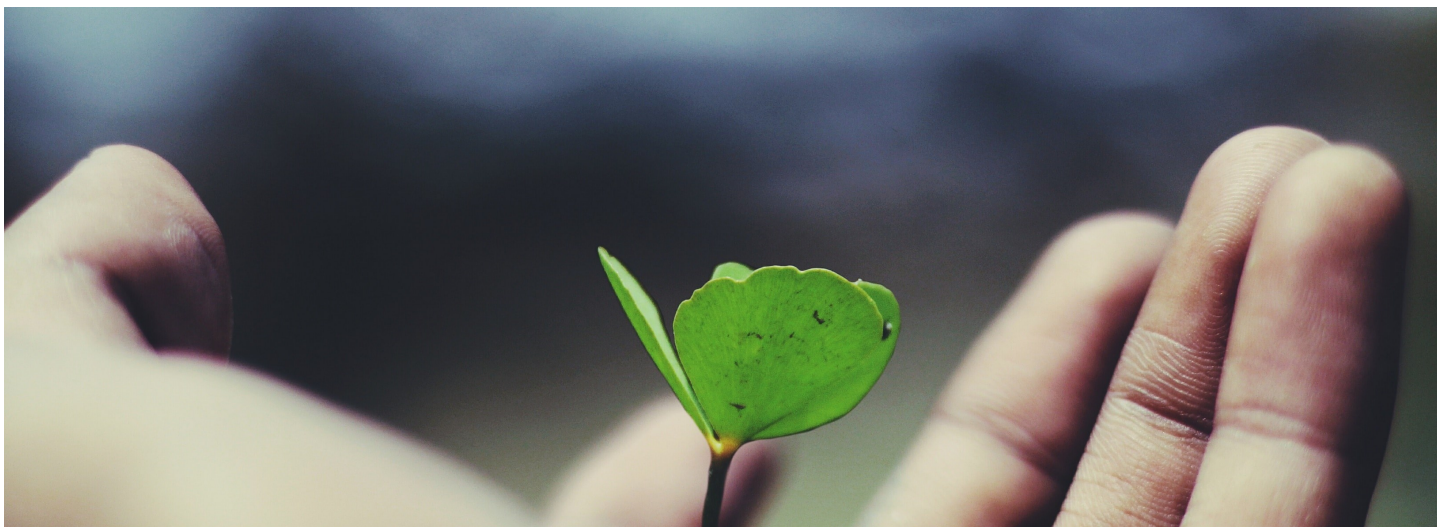

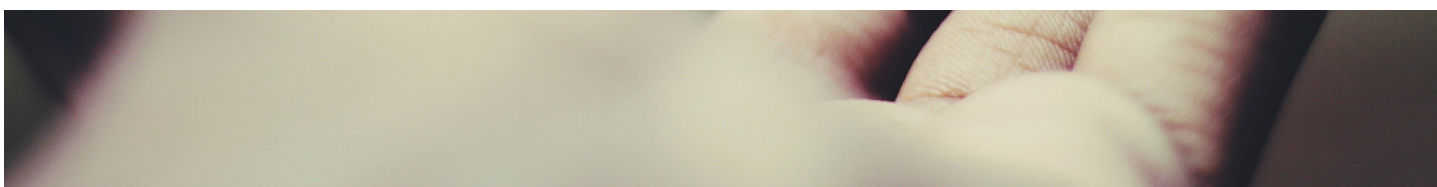
