Sunday, April 14, 2024 | Third Sunday of Easter

A Note from Fr. Keith, Our Pastor

Jesus entered Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover with his disciples. This Jewish feast commemorates the escape of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. Historically, during the Temple era, Passover, *pesach* in Hebrew, included a meal of unleavened bread and the sacrificial lamb. The Jews celebrated the Passover for seven days in the Temple or eight in the diaspora. The definitive sacrifice of Jesus, himself the sacrificial lamb of God, fulfilled and inaugurated a new freedom from slavery to sin.

Catholic Mass resembles the Passover meal with bread and wine offered using the Jewish *berakah* prayers. The prayers of consecration transform the bread and wine into the body and blood of Jesus as Christ himself commanded at the Last Supper, itself a Passover meal. We use the word Paschal as a connection to the Hebrew *pesach*. Our English word for Paschal is Easter. This is derived from the Saxon vernal, pagan festival. The Church “baptizes” these historical and pagan terms to make the meaning of the Christian mysteries accessible and inculturated.

Perhaps future generations will use different terms for Easter based on their culture. At any rate, the Church mirrors the Passover celebrations with the Octave of Easter. Liturgically, octaves celebrate the most important solemnities for eight days due to their prominence in the liturgical year. The rubrics before the reforms of the Second Vatican Council allowed for as many as eighteen different octaves! For example, Ascension was observed for eight days at the fortieth day of Easter only for Pentecost to be celebrated for eight days at the fiftieth day of Easter. The reformed liturgy after the Second Vatican Council retained only the octaves of Christmas and Easter.

The Octave of Easter concludes with the Second Sunday of Easter. This Solemnity has many different names. The most accurate and current title is Divine Mercy Sunday as a celebration of God’s forgiveness. Saint John Paul II established this feast in 2000. Interestingly, he died on the vigil of Divine Mercy five years later and beatified six years later on the feast itself. Historically, the Second Sunday of Easter was known as “White Sunday” as a reference to the garments of the baptized. The Latin phrase *in albis* refers to the alb or white baptismal garment. Quasimodo Sunday referenced the entrance antiphon and “Low Sunday” may have been a corruption of the Latin *laudes* or praise.

The titular character from the Hunchback of Notre Dame was found at the cathedral steps on the Second Sunday of Easter giving his name as Quasimodo. The entire Easter season is known as Paschaltide or Eastertide. The liturgical celebration each Sunday of Easter has several options not available during other seasons of the year. For example, the recitation of the Creed can be replaced by the Renewal of Baptismal Promises in a question and answer format. Additionally, the Sprinkling Rite can be used as a reminder of baptism. Finally, the Paschal Candle is lit each day and displayed in a prominent place in the sanctuary near the tabernacle or the ambo.

These liturgical details point to a deeper, spiritual invitation. Our Church was standing room only on Easter Sunday. These parishioners will not return again until Christmas and the following Ash Wednesday. Paschal joy is still a memory in many of these non-practicing neighbors of ours. We are encouraged to maintain an interior awareness and receptivity toward Paschal joy. The exuberance of Easter will naturally dissipate due to the human condition. However, our emotions and feelings are not the referent for the true joy of this season. The Resurrection of Jesus causes a real joy in the hope it offers for eternal life. Sin is conquered and death is vanquished. Please remember to share this with others.
